

Sculptures explore Mexico

Two sculptures exploring differing aspects of 20th Century Mexico will be unveiled at Thomas & Sons Gallery of Latin American Folk Art during the weekend of Sept. 28 and 29.

A bright red steel sculpture by famed Mexico City artist Sebastian is reminiscent of his abstract pieces that can be found in public places in Dallas, Denver, Brazil, Japan and Belize.

Sebastian is considered one of the leading contemporary sculptors of Latin America. The sculpture was secured with the help of Cheryl Natzmer, special

events coordinator at Schuler Books in Okemos, who is a personal friend of the artist.

"Reliquary for D.H.," a literary sculpture by East Lansing artist Sue Hensel, looks at the psychological inspirations behind the writings of English author D.H. Lawrence.

The 21-inch case with molded doors explores Lawrence's travels — especially his Mexican adventures — his relationship to women and his feelings about his own sexuality.
