Books and European Travel Featured on Sunday

An East Lansing artist who has established a national reputation for her literary sculptures and artist books will have her first major mid-Michigan exhibit during October.

Susan Hensel, whose recent shows in Ann Arbor, Santa Fe, New Mexico, and Birmingham, Alabama received considerable acclaim in the local media, opens an exhibit of her latest work at Thomas & Sons Bookstore and Gallery of Latin American Folk Art in downtown East Lansing on Sunday, Oct. 6, from noon to 5 p.m.

Hensel will be exhibiting more than 30 original books and sculptures, many made of her own handmade paper. The artist will be present at the opening to talk about her art and personally autograph her books.

At the adjacent David Olds Gallery, an exhibit of 19th-century European travel photos will be featured. Views of cities in England, France, Italy, Germany and Paris will all be included. And, in Thomas & Sons Gallery of Latin American Folk Art, the crafts of the Otavalo market in Ecuador continues.
