38 artists are drawn to Jackson exhibit

JACKSON — Some people write down their dreams. Susan Hensel draws hers. In fact, the East Lansing artist was so inspired by one of her sleeping visions that she created a winning mixed medium artwork, "The Gift."

Featuring pastels, sculptural materials, gold leaf, angel images, pearls and writings, "The Gift" now is on display at the annual Jackson Area Fine Arts Show at the Ella Sharp Museum in Jackson.

Hensel's creation won in the One-Person Show category and joins 52 works by 37 other artists who are showcasing and selling a wide range of media, including painting, sculpture, drawing, printmaking and photography.


"My objective was to look for works that married technical skill to creativity," says show juror Amy Braun Heiney of the Grand Rapids Art Museum.

"The works exhibit a unique quality, a distinct personality that identifies each artist's individual strength."

"Events in my life actually inspired The Gift," says Hensel, 50. "I was researching historical angels for a project and, because they've always been an important image for me, I drew them," she says. "Their wings represent a chosen freedom and a way to escape." Hensel studied art at the University of Michigan.

A dream-inspired work, Ted Matz's "Voice from Another Dream," is on display at the Jackson show. "Road of Dreams," by Bev Hundley of Galesburg, also hits the dream theme.

"There are so many unusual categories this year so it's fun to see all the different mediums," says Heather
