

Artist Susan Hensel Has "A Way with Words"



Sculptor and painter Susan Hensel was hooked when she bound her first book. After spending 20 years creating sculptural and decorative ceramics, she underwent a sea change and discovered the power of the book in all of its ramifications.

The Cultural Affairs Division of the city of Las Vegas Department of Leisure Services presents "A Way with Words," an exhibition of Hensel's multi-media books, from July 11 through August 24 at the Charleston Heights Arts Center, 800 South Brush Street. She will conduct a Japanese bookbinding workshop on Sunday, August 17, from 1 to 5 p.m. Admission is free. Call (702) 229-4674 for information and reservations.

Hensel's "books" are visually fascinating, but more significantly, they address issues of personal responsibility, the role of faith and values in individual lives, and the responsibility of the individual in the actions of the state. Her creations may be made from handmade paper with sculpted covers. They may include drawing, painting, cutouts, stamps, photographs, photocopies or whatever media she has at her disposal. To Hensel, "The way the books look, feel, move and smell are all important."

Hensel earned a bachelor of fine arts degree in painting and
